



## Soup Day



I adore the awesome crochet soup bowl cozies. The contoured form is amazing. I wanted the challenge of making a knitted cozy. Working with double strands makes the garter stitch extra squishy. Although, not as structured as the crochet version, still very functional and stylish for your kitchen. These can go right into the microwave with your bowl and provide safe lifting with the corners.

**\*\*Avoid getting the fabric wet as to prevent serious burns.**

### Supplies & Information

- **Yarn**  
(2) skeins Lily Sugar 'N Cream 100% Cotton  
(Enough for 2 bowls held double)
- **Needles**  
Size 9/5.5mm DPNs or Circular for magic loop
- Tapestry Needle
- Gauge: 13sts x 4.75 rows = 4" in garter st
- Size - Base diameter= 5"  
Top = 8" X 8"  
Fits a 6" bowl

Cast on 12 stitches holding 2 strands together

1. Knit across
2. sl 1<sup>st</sup> st, k10, turn
3. & all subsequent odd rows, knit across
4. sl 1<sup>st</sup> st, k9, turn
6. sl 1<sup>st</sup> st, k8, turn
8. sl 1<sup>st</sup> st, k7, turn
10. sl 1<sup>st</sup> st, k6, turn
12. sl 1<sup>st</sup> st, k5, turn
14. sl 1<sup>st</sup> st, k4, turn
16. sl 1<sup>st</sup> st, k to end

Repeat rows 1-16 (5) more times. (you will end at the center of the bowl)

Bind off leaving a 12" tail to sew up the seam and close the center of the bowl.

With the tail, mattress stitch the seam closed then run the needle through the end stitches of the

center. Pull the center closed and weave in remaining tail.

With 2 strands and inside of bowl facing you, pick up and knit 48 stitches around the top rim of the bowl. (Use the small bump at the end of each row. There may be 49 bumps due to the seam. If so, k2tog). Place marker.

1. p4, (m1,p8) x5, m1, p4
2. k54
3. p54
4. k5, (m1,k9) x5, m1, k4
5. p7, (m1,p1,m1,p14) x3, m1,p1,m1,p7
6. k8, (m1,k1,m1,k16) x3, m1,k1,m1,k8
7. p9, (m1,p1,m1,p18) x3, m1,p1,m1,p9

Cast off knitwise and weave in ends.

### Special Stitches & Abbreviations

#### Abbreviations:

- k** – knit
- p** – purl
- sl** – slip stitch purlwise
- st** – stitch
- m1** – make 1

#### Pick up & knit –

Bring a loop of yarn through a hole as if to knit and place it on your needle so that you can knit or purl it later.

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
